Background

Gratiot-Isabella Regional Educational Service District (GIRESD) formed a talent consortium of local education and business stakeholders to identify the challenges employers face in hiring and retaining quality talent. The consortium found that the biggest problem faced by local employers was that candidates lacked "essential workplace skills" such as time management, communication and teamwork which are needed in all jobs in all industries. Additionally, they found the following:



of employers said essential workplace skills were as important or more important than technical skills



of employers said that they have a difficult time finding potential new hires with essential workplace skills



of employers ranked essential workplace skills as important as cognitive skills such as reading and math ability



Problem

Job candidates lack essential "essential workplace skills"

Create a program to help students develop and demonstrate essential workplace skills needed for career success

Creating the Program



In conjunction with local employers, GIRESD created a comprehensive employability skills credentialing program they named "Workplace Citizenship Skills," to help students in grades 9-12 develop & demonstrate workplace skills employers identified as essential but lacking in potential hires. CTE Learn's CareerPrepped platform was chosen to facilitate the program.





We found most platforms simply taught soft skills and asked students to repeat information back or to pass a quiz. CareerPrepped is more comprehensive. It empowers students to build, prove and showcase their skills so they're visible and verifiable to employers.

To acquire GIRESD's "Workplace Citizenship Skills Certification," students in grades 9-12 must meet specific criteria which was developed in conjunction with GIRESD's talent consortium. Certification requirements are outlined below:

- **Completion** of specified CareerPrepped Skill Builder activities
- 80% of Skill Badges claimed and endorsed by an adult
- Minimum of two pieces of evidence for each badge (Skill Challenge activities on CareerPrepped are available to help build evidence)
- Must complete a presentation articulating the skills developed as a result of program participation and justify skill claims with evidence
- Good attendance as determined by school policy
- GPA of 2.0+ in 12th grade



- Schools comply with standard of the Michigan career development model requiring all students to graduate with a talent portfolio
- Students graduate with evidence of skills they can show employers
- Employers agree to give students with GIRESD's Workplace
 Citizenship Certification preferential treatment in hiring process
- Employers get qualified candidates with skills they say are typically hard to find and screen for
